- Document what you already know about your family history.
- Keep records of the what, when, where, how and why.
- Talk to older family members about people, places and events.
- View your pictures and those of other family members.
- Become familiar with U.S. and African American history.
- Find where your state's vital records, (birth, death, marriage, divorce, land records, etc.) are housed.
- Use internet websites like FindFamilyRoots.com and Ancestry.com to assist you in your search.
- Visit family, church and historical cemeteries. Read the markers.
